- **Fortify Your Login:** Use a strong, unique password and enable two-factor authentication (2FA) on every dating app. This prevents account takeovers, especially if another service you use suffers a data breach.
- **Review Built-In Privacy Features:** Take full advantage of "incognito mode," photo blurring, and location-masking tools offered by your chosen app.
- **Check Permissions & Delete Old Accounts:** Regularly check what data the app can access on your device and delete accounts from platforms you no longer use.

[AI-powered romance scams](#) have reached an alarming level of sophistication. In 2025 alone, these scams have cost victims over \$1.35 billion. Stay vigilant with these steps:

- **Verify Before Trusting:** Conduct a reverse image search on profile pictures to see if it's stolen from someone else. Check for consistency in their name, stories, and details across platforms.
- **Insist on Live Video:** A live video call is one of the best ways to verify you're talking to a real person. Consistently dodging video calls is a major red flag.
- **Stay On-Platform:** Keep all communication within the dating app's messaging system. Scammers often attempt to move conversations to SMS or encrypted messaging apps, such as WhatsApp, to evade detection and make reporting more difficult.
- **Guard Sensitive Information:** Never share financial details, intimate images, or deeply personal family information with someone you haven't met and verified. This material can be used for sextortion and blackmail.
- **Trust Your Gut:** If a conversation feels off, or an offer seems too good to be true, it probably is. pause or disengage immediately.
